On Wednesday, July 29, 2020, Governor Newsom announced that San Mateo County, was placed on the State of California's COVID-19 Watch List for monitoring for a three day period. Additional restrictions are imposed for some businesses which went into effect at 12:01 a.m. on Saturday, Aug. 1.

Like you, we are finding that all things are new and unfamiliar. Plans are in development for our faith formation programs, so we've put this survey together to collect some feedback from our St. Matthias parishioners. In order to aid in our planning, we would like to hear from you! Please complete the survey by August 15th.

Because of the uncertainty surrounding the COVID-19 health crisis we are planning to deliver our adult faith formation programs virtually this fall. If conditions change and it is safe to return to in-person gatherings later in the year, we are prepared to make that shift.

One-time and on-going opportunities are available at St. Matthias. Please take a few minutes to complete the survey. Results will be reported back to parishioners in a future edition of The Matthanian.

St. Matthias GIFT Family Survey

Thank you to the families who completed the GIFT Family Survey recently. The purpose of this survey was to determine which program model was preferred by families. Two models were offered: Option A: Altogether Live Gatherings and Option B: OnDemand Gatherings.

Based on responses received, approximately 50% of families indicated a preference for Option A, while the other 50% indicated preference for Option B. So, both models will be available to families.

Registration for GIFT and our other faith formation programs, including middle and high school youth ministry, First Holy Communion preparation and Confirmation preparation will begin the weekend of August 15-16th. Our first GIFT gathering is scheduled for September 13th.

Planning is still underway, but here's how GIFT is being envisioned right now:

- All families registered for GIFT will receive a Google Meet invite for each GIFT session which will be held twice a month on Sundays at 12 noon.
- Those who tune in will receive an introduction to the topic and instructions for the activities. The session will be recorded.
- The recording will be made available to all the families.

There will be a portal available (right now, we're exploring FlipGrid) which will contain all the session materials including the recordings of the sessions. FlipGrid allows users to post video or audio responses to prompts and activities providing a more interactive experience for families. Stay tuned as our planning develops.

SAINT TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS (EDITH STEIN) (1891-1942)

August 9

"Come," Edith gently whispered, taking her sister Rosa's hand, "let us go for our people!" These were Edith Stein's last words as the Nazis, enraged at the Dutch bishops' condemnation of their genocide, took into custody all Catholic converts from Judaism. Born Jewish, but non-practicing from her teens, Edith's search for truth led to a doctorate in philosophy, a brilliant career as professor and author and, finally, to the *Autobiography of Saint Teresa of Ávila*, which she read in one sitting, then declared, "That is the Truth!" Baptized on January 1, 1922, observed then as the feast of Jesus' initiation into the covenant of Abraham, confirmed on February 2, the feast of Jesus' Presentation in the Temple, Edith entered the cloistered Carmelites in Cologne, transferring to a convent in Holland when she realized that, because of the Nazi persecution of the Jews, her presence could imperil the safety of the other nuns. She died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz as a daughter of Israel and of the Church.

Perhaps the biggest challenge for the believer is to be constantly attuned to the possible presence of God in the everyday events of life. This is a stance that takes some people years to develop. Others seem to find the Lord easily in the simple things. As the week unfolds, let us look for the presence of God in the little things around us. Perhaps, like Elijah, we will be surprised at what we find. And, like the disciples, we can add our voice to the confession, "Truly you are the Son of God."
