

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

Who better than John the Baptist to guide us during this season of preparation for Jesus' coming? Today we see John travel throughout the region proclaiming a baptism of repentance and recalling the prophecy of Isaiah. Baruch's prophecy, which we hear in the first reading, echoes Isaiah as well. All three trumpet God's mercy and forgiveness as they envision the coming of the Lord. Let us heed their call

First Reading Bar 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God forever: wrapped in the cloak of justice from God, bear on your head the mitre that displays the glory of the eternal name. For God will show all the earth your splendor: you will be named by God forever the peace of justice, the glory of God's worship.

Up, Jerusalem! stand upon the heights; look to the east and see your children gathered from the east and the west at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that they are remembered by God.

Led away on foot by their enemies they left you: but God will bring them back to you borne aloft in glory as on royal thrones. For God has commanded that every lofty mountain be made low, and that the age-old depths and gorges be filled to level ground, that Israel may advance secure in the glory of God.

The forests and every fragrant kind of tree have overshadowed Israel at God's

command; for God is leading Israel in joy by the light of his glory,

with his mercy and justice for company.

Second Reading Phil 1:4-6, 8-11

Brothers and sisters:

I pray always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer:

that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception,

to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Lk 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert.

John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord,

make straight his paths.

Every valley shall be filled

and every mountain and hill shall be made low.

The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth,

and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Welcome to Advent

Welcome to a new liturgical year and the season of Advent! Advent includes the days and nights before the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas). Advent means "coming." During this time we read and sing about God's promises. It is a time of waiting and preparing. We wait for the blessed hope, the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We wait in hope that all will be one and the Kingdom of God will be realized.

In Advent, we prepare ourselves and our hearts for Jesus' birth, when the light of Christ pushes out the darkness. Our liturgical color is purple which is a symbol of reflection and anticipation. An Advent wreath is displayed and holds four candles. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. The four candles traditionally represent hope, faith, joy and peace.

While Advent is a time of celebration and anticipation *Dec. 15 Spirit Mass for the youthful of all ages. of Christ's birth, it is more than that. It is only in the shadow of Advent that the miracle of Christmas can fully be understood and appreciated.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, formerly RCIA) is a process in the Church to guide and support those who are responding to God's call to become a fully initiated member of the Roman Catholic Church. The first step in the process is a public acceptance of God's invitation and a welcome by the community of believers. On Sunday, December 8th at the 9:45 a.m. Mass at St. Matthias, Fr. Samuel led the ritual of the Rite of Acceptance and Welcome.


