Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

We hear Paul say, "The Lord is near," in the second reading today and we can count so many ways this is so. We're just ten days away from Christmas, for one. In a little while we will receive the Lord in the Eucharist. The Lord is here when two or more gather in his name. The Lord is near to us always, by virtue of our baptism. Right now, the Lord is here in the form of God's word. Warmed by the Lord's presence, let us listen for his voice in the words of scripture.

First Reading Zep 3:14-18

Shout for joy, O daughter Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel! Be glad and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The LORD has removed the judgment against you, he has turned away your enemies; the King of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst, vou have no further misfortune to fear. On that day, it shall be said to Jerusalem: Fear not, O Zion, be not discouraged! The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals.

Second Reading Phil 4:4-7

Brothers and sisters:
Rejoice in the Lord always.
I shall say it again: rejoice!
Your kindness should be known to all.
The Lord is near.
Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.
Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Lk 3:10-18

The crowds asked John the Baptist,

"What should we do?"

He said to them in reply,

"Whoever has two cloaks

should share with the person who has none.

And whoever has food should do likewise."

Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him,

"Teacher, what should we do?"

He answered them,

"Stop collecting more than what is prescribed."

Soldiers also asked him,

"And what is it that we should do?"

He told them.

"Do not practice extortion,

do not falsely accuse anyone,

and be satisfied with your wages."

Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals.

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn,

but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

Welcome to Advent

Welcome to a new liturgical year and the season of Advent! Advent includes the days and nights before the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas). Advent means "coming." During this time we read and sing about God's promises. It is a time of waiting and preparing. We wait for the blessed hope, the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We wait in hope that all will be one and the Kingdom of God will be realized.

In Advent, we prepare ourselves and our hearts for Jesus' birth, when the light of Christ pushes out the darkness. Our liturgical color is purple which is a symbol of reflection and anticipation. An Advent wreath is displayed and holds four candles. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. The four candles traditionally represent hope, faith, joy and peace.

While Advent is a time of celebration and anticipation of Christ's birth, it is more than that. It is only in the shadow of Advent that the miracle of Christmas can fully be understood and appreciated.

As we prepare ourselves for the coming of Jesus, we open ourselves to God's grace in the sacrament of Reconciliation. Simbang Gabi Mass

Simbang Gabi is a Filipino Catholic tradition of nine days of Masses leading up to Christmas. The term 5-6pm coordinates to "Night Mass" in Tagalog. In the Philippines, Masses are at dawn. Filipino Amercians Please go have brought Simbang Gabi to the United States. It is a way to celebrate and share culture and our faith. Masses are in the evening and include food JRCLosAlto and fellowship after each Mass.

Simbang Gabi is a time to prepare for the birth of Jesus and honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. Our southern San Mateo County parishes are each hosting one of the nine days of Masses. Each parish will display a parol which means "lantern." It represents the star that guided the Magi to the Christ child. Everyone is invited to attend one or more of the Masses. **St. Matthias will host Dec 19th, 7pm.**

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
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
