

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

We begin our journey into God's word today with some ancient proverbs, collected by Sirach to teach morality. What we say and what we do reveal the kind of person we are. Paul explains that because of Jesus, sin has been defeated and death cannot win in the end. In the Gospel, Jesus warns his disciples about being blind to one's own sins while at the same time judging others for theirs. May today's readings lead us to examine our words and actions and reflect on what they reveal to others.

First Reading

Sirach 27:4-7

When a sieve is shaken, the husks appear; so do one's faults when one speaks.

As the test of what the potter molds is in the furnace, so in tribulation is the test of the just.

The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had;

so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks,

for it is then that people are tested.

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 15:54-58

Brothers and sisters:

When this which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility

and this which is mortal clothes itself with immortality,

then the word that is written shall come about:

Death is swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?

The sting of death is sin,

and the power of sin is the law.

But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

<u>Gospel</u>

Luke 6:39-45

Jesus told his disciples a parable, "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye. "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good,

but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

During the 5 p.m. Mass on Saturday, March 15th, we will offer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. All those who are dealing with physical, mental, emotional or spiritual concerns are invited to receive this sacrament.

Parishioners are asked to share this information with family and friends. In addition, parishioners are encouraged to drive individuals who may have difficulty getting to St. Matthias.

After the homily, the priest will lay hands on each person and then anoint the forehead saying, "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit."

There will be special seating for those who will be receiving the sacrament. Those who are receiving the sacrament are asked to arrive early to sign in and receive a name tag. All parishioners are invited to join us for this special liturgical celebration.

Rite of Election

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly called RCIA) is a process for individuals seeking full initiation into the Catholic Church. Candidates have been on a journey of preparation and prayer for many months. The final weeks of preparation begin during Lent.

On March 9th, the First Sunday of Lent, the candidates from St. Matthias and St. Charles will participate in the Rite of Sending held at St. Matthias during the 9:45 a.m. Mass. This rite blesses and sends the candidates to the Cathedral later in the day. At 4 p.m. Archbishop Cordileone will be the presider for the Rite of Election. Our catechumens will be welcomed by the Archbishop and they will sign the Book of Elect. The Rite of Election is one major step toward receiving the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil.

During Lent and Holy Week, the Elect and our candidate will continue their preparation and participate in Scrutinies during selected Masses. The Scrutinies are prayers and petitions asking God to bless these individuals and give them the spiritual strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life for all of us.

This journey culminates with the Elect receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist and our Candidate receiving Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil on April 19th. Please pray for them, their families and their sponsors.
